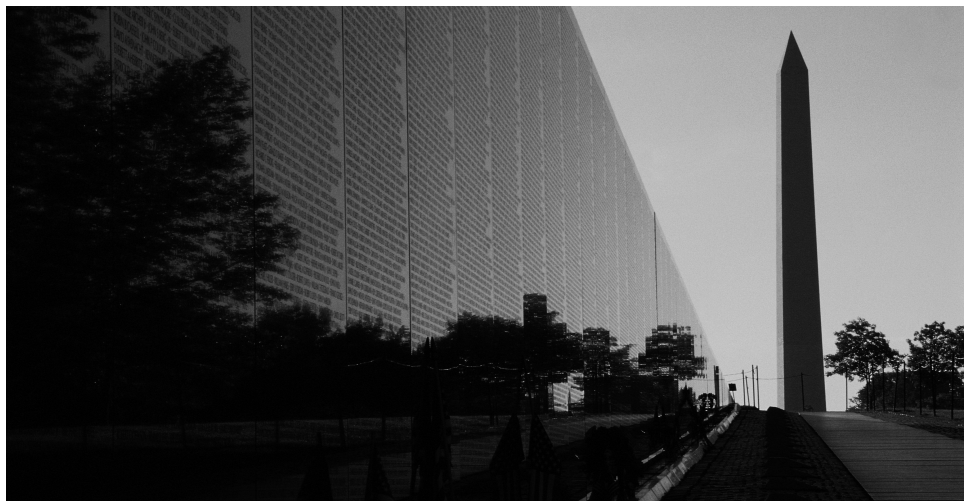

# We Need Your Completed Registration Now!!!

If you are planning to attend the 2010 Reunion in DC and have not returned your registration form, ***please take the time to fill it out, enclose the required fees and mail it today.*** You will find a copy of that form in this Newsletter. Be sure to fill out both sides of the form so we will have the information we need to complete all the tasks that need to be done in the short time remaining before the Reunion.

You may notice that we are asking for payment in advance for registrations, banquet meals and extra shirt and hat orders. This is because the 'good ole days of the handshake agreement' are lost to the ages, replaced by large corporations and their policies. Our contract calls for all of the Association's hotel related expenses to be paid 3 weeks before our Reunion. These costs include items such as Hospitality Room rental, banquet meals, audio/visual equipment, etc. Additionally, the bus company fees must be paid at the same time.

There are other reasons that we need to know about your attendance at the Reunion but two big ones are the shirt/hat orders and your nametags. We want to be sure that we have the shirts that you need in the sizes that you need and that we have a correctly printed nametag for you. However, those items don't magically appear as we wish they would and much work has to be completed in a few short weeks. Regarding the shirts and hats, your trooper registration includes one shirt and one hat but if you want additional items, you can fill out the "extras" portion of the form and remit the fees with your registration. We will have a very limited "extra" inventory at the Reunion and they will be sold on a first come, first serve basis. To guarantee that you have the items that you want, place your order now and remember, the deadline for ordering these products in time for the reunion is August 1, 2010.

We ask you on the form if you are planning to stay at the Holiday Inn/National Airport and we want to be sure that you know that this is information for the Association only and that you must make your own room reservations with the Hotel.

Lastly, we have had some requests to have pictures on nametags. We are still working on how this can be accomplished but if you can bring a ***very small*** (1.5" x 2") "IN COUNTRY" photo of yourself, we will try to have space on your nametag to accommodate the photo.

Our Hotel offers all the usual amenities including HD TV, coffee makers, hair dryers and high-speed Internet access and free parking for Hotel guests. # Where Do You Need To Be . . . When?

If you have attended any of the previous reunions, you will find that our daily agenda stays basically the same. From the excitement of Thursday's opening registrations to the quiet sadness of Sunday morning's farewells. As you may have noticed, we've tried to offer you a reunion that will give you something to do each day of your Washington, D.C. visit while still giving you adequate personal time to check out those places of importance to you. But, while this pattern continues to rule the days, each reunion has a schedule of its own as well. So, we will use this portion of the Bulletin to acquaint you with the details that may affect your plans on each of these morning wake-ups.

Thursday is registration day and once you have that accomplished your remaining hours are yours to spend, as you like almost. ## Getting The Most From Your Sightseeing \$\$\$\$\$



Our hotel offers free shuttle service to the two area Metro Train Stations, one located at Reagan International Airport and the other at the Crystal City underground mall area. With just these two kickoff sites, you will have access to anything that's worth seeing. And, just as importantly, these boarding docks give you control of 'where, when, how, what and who' you will visit to make the most of your free-time opportunities. If you are looking for a lift downtown, the Metro system can put the puzzle together for you, and make sure that you do get back to your pickup and drop off points as you would like.

If touring the National Mall and surrounding monuments is high on your priorities list, we recommend you check out the Tourmobile Sightseeing packages. These trams make continuous loops around the Mall area with stops at more than 40 historic places. They offer one-day rates, two-day packages and some evening tours. You can buy tickets at tickets stations on the Mall or just pay one of the drivers for your pass. Even better, the unlimited 'hop on, hop off' policy doesn't tie you to any kind of schedule and/or visits that may carry no special meaning for you. The Tourmobile is also capable of providing specific tours to many sites outside the 'Beltway' such as Mount Vernon or the Frederick Douglass National Historic Park. The Tourmobile is not the only way to see the sites but it is the one recommended by the National Parks Service.

We hope that you will do some of your own investigating before you get to DC, make a plan that allows you the best chance to see your high priority sites and make the most of your time in our Nation's Capital.
